**I. REGULAR MEETING CALLED TO ORDER**

A. Approval of March 14, 2016 Committee Minutes

**Fran Corderro-Settel moved to approve the minutes as presented.** Christina Garrett seconded. All said "aye" and the minutes were approved.

**VI. BUSINESS**

**A. New Member Introduction**

Keith Stone introduced himself to the Committee members. He explained that he has been part of the Medford Multicultural Committee and part of planning their annual fair. He also presented an idea for the Ohana Festival he is preparing to have in September. He would like to see the event as a Central Point Multicultural Event. He explained his plans for the event and what the City of Central Point could help with. The Committee is in support of the event but concerned that there is not enough time to get the city involved to the extent he is hoping for. These items need to be budgeted because there would be staff time and financing needed to help for 2016. Deanna will discuss the event with the City Manager and department directors to see if they are able to help in any way.

**B. ADA Compliant Assistance**

Deanna explained that the City is looking for specific people to contact for addressing citizens with disabilities or language barriers. The state requires us to be able to provide an interpreter for several reasons, meetings, paying bills or dealing with Police Officers. It came to our attention when the City of Medford asked us who we use for sign language interpretation.

Christina Garrett stated that Mae Richardson Elementary has People who use sign language in class rooms. They may be a resource for the City. Committee member Dolores Cadwallader has volunteered to be a Spanish interpreter for the Police Department in the past.

Committee members will research and send names to Mrs. Casey to compile a list.

**C. Event Participation**

The Multicultural Fair is September 24<sup>th</sup>. The Committee is in favor of participating in this again. They all agreed it would be good to have small things to hand out and free give away items. Committee members should send email suggestions to Mrs. Casey who can then purchase the items out of the MCC Funds that were not used for a Scholarship.

Amy Sweet – Religious events: Nothing new to report.

Christina Garrett – Expo and Native American Events: She attended the spring Powwow at SOU and one in Grants Pass.
