

## Floodplain Development Application Checklist Type II Projects

This checklist provides a comprehensive list of the submittal requirements needed for floodplain development projects subject to Type II, administrative, procedures set forth in the Central Point Municipal Code.
<ul> <li>This checklist applies to the following project types:</li> <li>☑ Projects located in the special stream setback area</li> <li>☑ Bank stabilization projects that utilize vegetative planting techniques and contribute no fill or material other than vegetation to the stream channel, stream bank or surrounding area</li> </ul>
Submit two hard copies of completed application packet, as well as a disc with Adobe PDF files. Incomplete Applications <u>Will Not</u> Be Accepted.
Completed Floodplain Development Application form.
Narrative statement explaining how the proposal meets each of the review criteria.
One set of pre-addressed mailing labels based on most current Assessor's Data Include the applicant and all owners or contract purchasers, property owners within 100-feet of the project site, any neighborhood or community organization whose boundaries include the proposed site.
Site Plan:
North arrow
Property line boundaries
Adjacent roadways, driveways, stream crossings, utilities or other infrastructure
Existing and proposed structures
Location of any creeks or other waterways on or adjacent to the property Approximate centerline of the waterway Top of bank
Location of existing trees/vegetation/debris (indicate removal, if applicable)
Location and description of any materials to be stored onsite during and/or after development
Location and extent of any proposed alterations to a watercourse, including bank stabilization
Location and quantity of fill, grade and excavation activities
Location of any restoration activities, such as native plantings in the riparian corridor
Grading Plan: Illustrate existing and proposed site elevations in plan <u>and</u> profile views. Specify location and quantity of fill and excavation, source of fill material & onsite disposal location(s).
Structural Plans, if applicable. (Same as Building Permit submittal requirements)
Copies of all other local, state or federal permit approvals.
Central Point Storm Drain Protection Permit for projects with ground-disturbing activities
DEQ 1200-C Permit for project sites greater than one acre.
