



Central Point Police Department 2018 Accomplishments

Our officers handled 9635 cases in 2018. These calls for service can range from a simple abandoned auto to a complex criminal investigation.

K-9 Units Our K-9 units pair experienced officers with certified drug detection canines, trained to alert to the characteristic odors of certain narcotics. Since the implementation of our 1st K-9 unit, Officer Munoz and Mattis, drug arrests increased 40%. These positive results prompted the addition of a second K-9 unit in 2018, Officer Cunningham and Sage.

Social Media Outreach In 2018, we increased our department's social media presence reaching over 13,000 followers on four different platforms. Our *Traffic Safety First Videos* debuted in 2018, educating our citizens on current Traffic Statutes and Safety Issues.



Central Point Police Department achieved Accreditation through the Oregon Accreditation Alliance; a voluntary program designed to recognize police departments that commit to upholding the standards and practices that best protect and serve their citizens.

D.A.R.E. In addition to having two school resource officers working with the School District, our officers also completed the D.A.R.E program with 300 students from Mae Richardson, Jewett Elementary and Central Point Elementary.

Community Service Officers An additional Community Service Officer position was created to assist our citizens with the quality of life issues, including ordinance violations, weed abatement, and helping to create Neighborhood Watch associations.

Property & Evidence Our Property & Evidence department took in over 1900 items of property and released almost 2000, including a donation of bicycles to the Teresa McCormick Center.

VIPS 19 Volunteers in Police Service (VIPS) served our community by assisting our department with a myriad of duties including Vacation House Checks, traffic control and assisting with special events.



Explorers Our Explorers provided over 300 hours of service for community and city events, and as well as participated in 12 events at the annual Law Enforcement Challenge, taking 1st place in courtroom testimony and 3rd in marksmanship at Range.

Crater Foundation The Central Point Police Association donated a scholarship to the Crater Foundation in memory of Officer Willie Mott.
