



## Central Point Police Department 2019 Accomplishments

Our officers handled 10174 cases in 2019. These calls for service can range from a simple abandoned auto to a complex criminal investigation.

**School Resource Officers/ D.A.R.E.** School Resource Officers worked with schools, parents and partner agencies with conflict resolution, preventing juvenile delinquencies, providing police services to the school and grounds as well as participation in school functions. Our DARE instructors instructed the fifth graders at 3 of the elementary schools in DARE education, culminating in a graduation from the program, and everyone's favorite event, DARE DAY!

**K9 Units** Our K9 units assisted patrol with identifying potential drug related offenses, not only with our agency but also partnering with other agencies to assist with detection of methamphetamines, cocaine and heroin.

**Social Media Outreach** Continued to provide Traffic Safety First Videos helped educate our citizens on important Oregon Statutes and safety information. In addition to Facebook, we also maintained Instagram, Twitter, and YouTube accounts, and a mobile app to ensure our commitment to engage with the community in a timely manner.



**Community Works Advocate** Through a Department of Justice Grant, we added a full time community advocate to our department. Our advocate worked with our officers to provide our citizens with safety, emotional support and resources for those who have experienced domestic violence, sexual assault or stalking.

**Community Service Officers** The addition of a second community service officer, allowed for help with quality of life issues affecting our citizens 7 days a week.

**Property & Evidence** Our Property & Evidence department took in 2,184 items of property and released almost 2,500 items.

**VIPS** The Volunteers in Police Service (VIPS) served our community by assisting our department with a myriad of duties including Vacation House Checks, traffic control and assisting with special events.. The VIPS staffed the Guardian Angel Program, where volunteers visit those in need, listening to their concerns or issues, and providing information on organizations that might best serve.



**Explorers** Our Explorers assisted traffic control at city parades, placing and removing flags during appropriate holidays, including the 2019 Polar Plunge. They also participated in 8 events at the annual Law Enforcement Challenge, taking 1st place in Officer Survival.

- \* Provided Willie Mott Scholarship through the Crater Foundation
- \* Participated in the City Wide Open House
- \* Partnered with KOB1-5 to support a campaign for suicide awareness "We are in this Together"
- \* Provided 11 ALICE trainings in the community
- \* Provided 12 concealed handgun license courses
